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Welcome to the *Reading Horizons Discovery*[®] Weekly Student Packet! In this packet, you'll find activities that students can do independently along with some activities that require the help of a fluent reader.

Guided Practice Activities

These activities need to be completed with the help of a fluent reader.

Homework Pages

Each Homework Page includes a concise overview of what was covered in that week of instruction. This information can serve as a review for the student and as a synopsis for anyone assisting in the home. This skill review was not designed to be reading practice for the student. Each square in the Tic-Tac-Toe design of the page includes instructions for the student. A fluent reader should be available to assist in reading these instructions if necessary.

Building Words Activities

The student should cut out the accompanying letter cards. A fluent reader should read the Building Words Activity script aloud to the student while the student uses the cards to spell the words. The letter cards include both upperand lowercase letters. Encourage the student to practice proper capitalization by only using the uppercase letters when necessary.

Independent Practice Activities

These activities are designed to allow the student to complete them independently. In some cases, small portions of the activities below (like instructions) may require minimal involvement by a fluent reader.

Cloze Passages

The student should use the words on the second page of the activity to fill in the blanks on the first page. The passages are designed to include only words that students have learned the necessary skills to read independently.

Building Words Transfer Cards

The Building Words Transfer Card uses words from the Building Words Activity in sentences designed to help students practice reading skills.

Practice Pages

Instructions at the top may need to be read to the student.

Sort and Spell Activities

Sort and Spell activities include three parts: the Word Sort, Fill-in-the-Blank Sentences, and Word Sort Questions. The Word Sort Questions are designed to challenge the student to think critically, so many of these questions will need to be read to the student. The other parts are designed for independent practice.

In the Word Sort, the words can be cut out and moved into the appropriate columns on the sort page. The student could also use the words in the bank as a reference and write the words into the correct columns. The student should use the words from the sort to complete the Fill-in-the-Blank sentences.

(Form A) Spelling Lesson Week 33: Reversed Vowels

Date

Spelling Skill: Al/IA: The reversed vowel pair *ia* is used to spell long *i* and either short *a* or the schwa (e.g., *diagonal, diagram*). The *ia* combination is also used to spell long *e* and short or long *a* or the schwa (e.g., *piano, media*). **OE/EO:** *Eo* is used to spell long *e* followed by long or short *o* or the schwa (e.g., *video, geometry, leotard*). **OA/AO:** *Ao* is used to spell long *a* followed by short or long *o* (e.g., *chaos, Naomi*). **UI/IU:** *Iu* is used to spell long *e* and short *u* (e.g., *medium, stadium*). **AU/UA:** *Ua* is used to spell long *u* followed by long or short *o*, or the schwa (e.g., *situation, casual*). **OI/IO:** *Io* is used to spell long *i* followed by long or short *o*, or the schwa (e.g., *violet, ion, lion*). *Io* is also used to spell long *e* and long *o* (e.g., *audio, radio*).







Building Words Review Activity for Spelling Lesson Week 33 Reversed Vowels Alternates






Building Words

Let's practice spelling words with reversed vowels. The adjacent vowels *a*-*i* reverse to form *i*-*a*.

- 1. Spell the word *dial*. Please turn down the volume *dial*.
- 2. Spell the word *media*. Newspapers and television are types of *media*.

The adjacent vowels *a*-*u* reverse to form *u*-*a*. Let's practice some words with the *u*-*a* spelling.

- 3. Spell the word *dual*. Each team member will have a *dual* role.
- 4. Spell the word *graduate*. The students will *graduate* next month.

The adjacent vowels o-e reverse to form e-o. Let's practice some words with the e-o spelling.

- 5. Spell the word *eon*. An *eon* is a very long period of time.
- 6. Spell the word *video*. She learned to cook this soup by watching a *video*.

The adjacent vowels *o-i* reverse to form *i-o*. Let's practice some words with the *i-o* spelling.

- 7. Spell the word *lion*. The *lion* slept in the shade of a tree.
- 8. Spell the word *radio*. We heard that song on the *radio*.

The adjacent vowels *u*-*i* reverse to form *i*-*u*. Let's practice some words with the *i*-*u* spelling.

- 9. Spell the word *stadium*. The teams will play in the new *stadium*.
- 10. Spell the word *genius*. Our friend is a *genius* at math.

Ask students to use the Sounds Cards from this lesson to form as many words as they can in a specific amount of time (1-5 minutes depending on the needs of your students).

Bonus Activity

Have students write a sentence with as many words from the lesson as they can.
