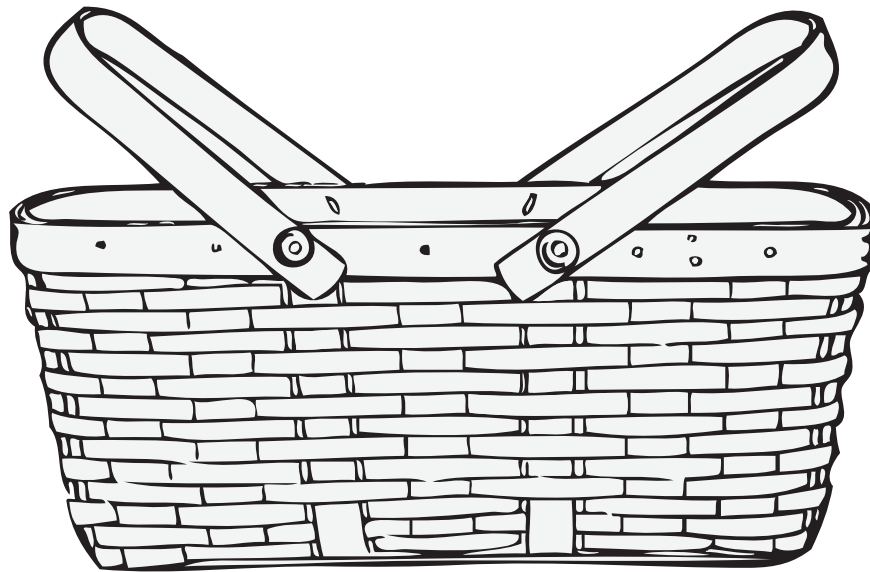

Lesson 74: Spelling with -C

Most of the time when there is a multi-syllabic word ending with the /k/ sound, the end sound is spelled with a c. Exception: *attack*.
