Consonants X and Y






The name of this letter is x. X is a consonant. When x begins a word, it has the sound of z, so we will learn its <u>ending sound</u> first. At the end of a word, x says /ks/.


## Lesson 29: Consonant X

Write each slide with the slide arrow. Read each slide, and then write each word one time. Mark an x under the vowel. Then read the word.








The name of this letter is y. Y is a consonant when it begins a word. The sound of y is /y/, as in yes.

Write each slide with the slide arrow. Read each slide, and then write each word one time. Mark an x under the vowel. Then read the word.




