






Job Title of Respondents






What is your school plan for next school year?






What platform or technology(s) will you use for remote learning?






What % of your students have access to the internet and resources needed for remote learning?










If any learning will occur remotely, what model of instruction are you going to use?






If teaching remotely, how many hours/day will teachers be expected to provide instruction?






How many hours/day will students be expected to participate in remote learning?






If students will be receiving some instruction at school, what is your anticipated schedule?






What are your plans for in-service and/or professional development in the fall?






Do you anticipate needing additional literacy resources/curriculum this fall?






Compared to previous reading instruction, what performance expectations do you have for remote learning?






What concerns do you have about meeting the needs of students with dyslexia, in Tiers 2 and 3, those with 504 Plans and IEPs, ELL students in remote settings?
